RAEDI Mission Statement

Retain, grow and diversify the Rochester area economy.





Economic Development Fund

Voter approval to extend the Rochester sales tax in November 2012 provided \$10 million to establish economic development funds for the City of Rochester and area communities. Rochester's fund will be capitalized with \$5 million. The Rochester City Council and the RAEDI Board of Directors have since approved an agreement that authorizes RAEDI's administration of the fund. As part of this process, the board established an Investment Committee that has developed program guidelines and an application process. We expect to consider applications for funding within the first quarter of 2013. RAEDI was instrumental in lobbying the legislature for including the \$10 million in the bill authorizing the sales tax.

Business Accelerator Center

RAEDI has partnered with Mayo Clinic and the City of Rochester to create a Business Accelerator Center within the Minnesota BioBusiness Center. Companies licensing Mayo technology will be given priority for space. Mayo Clinic, the city, and RAEDI all contributed funds to pay for the Center's buildout and operations. The facility will open March 1, 2013, with tenants occupying 5 of 6 offices and 4 of 6 workstations.

FedEx Ground

In 2008, RAEDI was visited by a real estate consulting group who was representing a logistics company looking to locate a Regional Logistics Center. RAEDI prepared a list of area sites that met the company's location criteria. We then provided them a driving tour of each site selected for review. As the economy slipped into recession, this project was put on hold but resurfaced again late last year when the City of Stewartville was contacted and began the process of securing the location of FedEx Ground. The facility, now nearly completed, is located just west of Kwik Trip on the north end of town. FedEx expects to begin operations at the new site in the second guarter of 2013. The 60,000 square foot facility, over time, could employ as many as 60 people.

RAEDI Board Task Groups Established in 2012 by RAEDI Board


The RAEDI Board of Directors established three task groups during 2012. The Business Retention Task Group was established to make routine calls on area businesses whose primary customers are located outside of the immediate area. These businesses are important because their success helps to determine how many dollars are actually available within the local economy. The task group calls on these businesses to thank them for their investments and to learn of any opportunities we might have to be of service to them. The Entrepreneurial Task Group was established to identify strategies and actions RAEDI can take to facilitate creation and sustaining of an entrepreneurial friendly "eco system." Establishment of the local economic development fund and the business accelerator are two outcomes directly related to the work of this group. Finally, the Growth Task Force formed a joint-planning committee with the Rochester Area Chamber of Commerce to strategize and plan for our organizations' long-term collective role with regard to economic development.



SBA Loan Origination

During 2012, RAEDI, through the SBA 504 program, funded 18 loans for a total investment of \$31.5 million. The servicing portfolio today has a total of 112 loans with an outstanding balance of about \$46 million. RAEDI anticipates 2012 activity not only to result in new business investment but additional tax base and approximately 109 new jobs.

Total Employment for Rochester MSA



Zip Rail

RAEDI retained the highly-regarded firm of R.L. Banks & Associates, Inc. to guantify the local, regional, and state-wide economic impact of Zip Rail, a highspeed passenger rail project linking the economic centers of Rochester and the Twin Cities metropolitan area. The analysis suggests that the economic benefits of Zip Rail could easily exceed both the initial capital cost and the long-term operating cost of the project. Zip Rail has the potential to produce over \$27.5 billion of statewide economic benefits as well as 8,000 new jobs statewide. Based on these potential economic benefits, the study concluded that further study of the Zip Rail's feasibility makes sense.
