
Second Quarter 2020

Total Employment

Nonagricultural wage and salary employment for the Rochester MSA decreased by 6.7% over the last year. The loss of 8,352 jobs brought the total employment figure to 117,088 from the June 2019 level of 125,440. Goods Producing has shown a gain of 292 jobs over the last 12 months while Service Providing reported a loss of 8,644 jobs.

The Covid-19 pandemic has played a significant role in the reduction of jobs in the service sector.

Unemployment

The Rochester MSA unemployment rate increased by 5.0% from the same period last year and was 8.0% at the end of the second quarter. Despite the pandemic, the Rochester average continues to remains below the state and U.S. averages of 8.5% and 11.2% respectively.


The labor force in June was 128,861, which was .8 higher than the June 2019 figure of 127,784.

Airport Traffic

The Rochester International Airport serviced 8,066 passengers during the second quarter of 2020. This is a decrease of 91.4% over second quarter 2019 (93,764 passengers). The impact of Covid-19 during second quarter 2020 severely impacted the number of travelers. Passenger totals for April, May, and June were 1,121, 2,985, and 3,960 respectively.

United Airlines temporarily suspended flights out of Rochester beginning on July 6. United says this move is being taken under the 2020 CARES Act passed by Congress to assist many businesses suffering from the coronavirus-induced lockdowns affecting much of the

American economy. Under the Act, the U.S. Department of Transportation can authorize airlines to suspend flights in selected markets based on demand. "We remain hopeful that United will reinstate services when the overall demand for air travel begins to improve," said John Reed, Executive Director of Rochester International Airport.

The Airport and airlines have all instated measures to ensure travel is safe for those with essential travel needs.



Hotel/Motel Sales Tax - City of Rochester



Net Sales Tax - Second Quarter



Second Quarter Building Activity

Commercial and residential building permits issued for second quarter 2020 totaled \$73,932,243. This is a decrease of 36.1% over 2019.

Permits over \$1 million for second quarter 2020 included: Building addition interior finishes, exterior enclosure and MEP system for new police department precinct addition (North Services Center and Police Station - BP5), Renovation of second floor, adding kitchen equipment with hood and light fixture replacement (John Adams Middle School), "Mechanical - HVAC work for hotel new 172 room hotel with 2 levels of parking, 1st floor meeting rooms, swimming pool, guest kitchen and lobby bar (Civic on First), 76 unit multi-family apartment building - 4 levels of wood framing over 1 level of precast underground parking (Century Heights), installation of fermenter equipment, remove and replace roof structure upgrade fire sprinkler and MEP, and new platforms and railings (Kerry Foods - Ingredients Buildings), Remodel of the interior spaces of the church and reroof of the entire facility (Zumbro Lutheran Church), New passenger boarding bridge and fixed passenger walkway that connects to terminal building, minor alterations to exterior wall (Rochester International Airport), New slab on grade mental health facility for adolescents and adults (Olmsted County Regional Crisis Center), tenant fit-up into 4th floor One Discovery Square (RION Health).

Second Quarter Housing Activity

Home listings in southeastern Minnesota decreased by 17.4% from a year ago, and pending sales increased by 28.5% from the same period last year. Prices moved higher as the median sales price was up 3.8% to \$228,250, while the average sales price was up by 4.8%.

While buyer activity continues to be robust, seller activity continues to be a bit softer, with fewer homes being listed for sale than a year ago. Many housing experts believe sellers remain reluctant to list their homes due to continued concerns over COVID-19, which was beginning to see a resurgence in June.
